The New Arizona Medical Eye Unit Arrives!!!



As 2016 comes to a close, the AOS Foundation and Arizona Lions have much to celebrate! The new Arizona Medical Eye Unit (AMEU) was christened on October 29, 2016 at the Sheraton Four Points, Phoenix South Mountain. The new trailer has significant upgrades that include a more fuel efficient design, auto leveling, a handicapped entry lift, larger exam lanes and new ophthalmic equipment! The new auto-refractor and lensometer will reduce exam times and improve efficiency. The combination of a new trailer and relatively new truck will allow the AMEU to continue serving the ophthalmic needs of rural Arizonans well into the future.

The old trailer is retiring to Mexico as a gift from the Arizona Lions to the Mexican Caborca Lions Club. While it served us well since 1976, it will continue it's eye care mission in Northern Mexico. Our former trailer was gratefully received and it will be used in the same capacity, with a less demanding travel schedule.



While we celebrate the new trailer our work continues to raise funds for a power generator and to identify and train AMEU staff for the next generation of clinics.

An interview with the AOS Foundation Chair Jeff Edelstein, M.D.

Q: Why did you start the AOS Foundation?

A: The AMEU program has been chugging along with 50–70 clinics/year since 1976. In 2011, I felt it was necessary to create a sustainable funding mechanism to ensure a strong future for the program because of the positive impact it has on rural Arizonan's that lack access to medical eye care.

Q: Why do AOS members volunteer their services?

A: AOS members have been remarkably generous with their time due to the rewards of giving back to the community. They are

rewarded by interacting with Arizonans in areas not typically travelled and receiving the kindness of grateful patients. Over the 30 years I've been doing annual clinics, I find there are always one or two patients per clinic where I've made a dramatic impact on the quality of their lives. The AMEU experience differs from the daily office experience and offers a chance to rekindle skills due to the diversity of patients.

Q: Who are the key members of the AOS Foundation Board?

A: We have enjoyed significant success since AOSF began and I have many to thank, but I could not have done this without Christy Mikesell who has been an energetic force in executing the vision for our annual campaign events and corporate sponsorships. Of course, Greg King Director AMEU, has been a wealth of compelling stories and photos generated from AMEU clinics as well as his in-depth knowledge of the needs for rural community and Indian Health Centers. Robert Spurny MD has a similar 30+ year history working AMEU clinics and as OPAC Chair is able to shine the light on rural patient needs to State and National politicians who can be removed from that reality. Finally, Jeannette Russell, Executive Director Arizona Lions, has such a passion for this program seen by her operational management skills, collaboration with other Lions Clubs and fundraising to keep the AMEU alive.

Q: What challenges did you face?

The urgency became apparent in 2014 when the AMEU trailer door literally fell off the trailer on the freeway! The early AOSF fundraising from silent auctions set the groundwork for our move to larger events. In 2015, the success of our Top Golf event evolved with Christy following her mother's philanthropic tradition and Ophthalmic Instruments, Inc soliciting corporate sponsorships. Bob Spurny MD created "event buzz" with the "King's Cup" travelling trophy. The "Cup" transformed Bob into an effective spokesman and recruiter for the event. I brought in GiveSmart which streamlined event management through an online platform allowing digital registration, consignment items for auction, pre–event bidding, on–site/remote Silent Auction bidding and post event accounting. This years "Casino Night" was a similar success netting over \$18,000!
